<h3>Early Years Foundation Stage</h3> <p>Encounter and Discover</p> <p>Learners follow the EYFS curriculum throughout Early Years and Year 1. This is a developmental curriculum, which plays a diagnostic role in establishing which of the three Swiss Cottage Curricula the child begins in Year 2. The three key areas on the core EYFS curriculum are Communication, Language and Literacy, Physical Development, and Personal and Social Development.</p>
